

UPSAs

- N1 Perform patient observations and calculate Early Warning Score speak to ward nurses/care assistants
- N2 Instruct a patient in collecting an MSSU and dipstick the sample speak to ward doctors
- N3 Take nose, throat or skin swabs **speak to ward doctors**
- N4 Venepuncture speak to ward doctors and/or phlebotomy room
- N5 Cannulation of a vein speak to ward doctors
- N6 Measure capillary blood glucose **speak to ward nurses**
- N7 Perform a peak flow
- N8 Administer oxygen and discuss its prescription speak to ward doctors
- N9 Perform a 12 lead ECG speak to ward doctors to identify patient, then accompany nurses
- N10 Scrubbing up for a procedure

Sign Off Requirements

- Attend all timetabled sessions
 - If unwell/etc then please notify university, as per usual procedures, and Dr George -Very important
- Take at least three histories/week
 - Present at least one history/week to a ward doctor and get signed off
 - At least 2 neurology Cases
 - Please do at least 2 physical examination along with history
- One enhanced case presentation in the placement
 - Dr George will facilitate
